MUSEUM BOARD

A public hearing was held concerning a study grant. The Museum Board's desire is to obtain a grant to identify ways to display the museum. The grant requires a match and Zeiger asked how the match would be made. Gene Carrico, representing the Museum requested \$2,500.00 from the Commissioners. Carrico also requested the Commissioners apply for the grant and administer the grant funds. Zeiger told the Museum Board that the County could not do anything until the 1992-1993 budget.

A motion was made by Fleming, seconded by Graalman and carried to adopt the following:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CARBON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AUTHORIZING THE CARBON COUNTY MUSEUM BOARD TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR A PLANNING ONLY GRANT FROM THE STATE OF WYOMING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM AND CERTIFYING THAT ALL PUBLIC PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS HAVE BEEN MET

WHEREAS, public notice of the public meeting to discuss the application for a Community Development Block Grant was published seven days prior to the hearing and informed citizens of the dollar amount available, the range of allowed activities and other pertinent information, as well as provided information concerning the time and location of the hearing, and

WHEREAS, citizen participation has been encouraged and provided for with particular emphasis on participation by persons of low and moderate income who are residents of Carbon County; and

WHEREAS, the improvement and upgrading of the Carbon County Museum will provide a richer educational and cultural resource to our citizens as well as a valuable tourist attraction which would provide direct and indirect jobs for low and moderate income people; and

WHEREAS, the economic health and vitality of Carbon County is of utmost concern to the Commissioners and job creation, stability of the tax base, and economic generators such as a revitalized Carbon County Museum are crucial to our economic development;

WHEREAS, the Carbon County Museum Board wishes to obtain a CDBG-Planning Only Grant for the purpose of obtaining a museum master plan, a feasibility study for upgrading the present museum or relocating the museum, a site analysis and strategies for marketing the museum to tourists;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Carbon County Commissioners on this day, January 7, 1992, hereby endorses the Carbon County Museum Board's application for a CDBG-Planning Only Grant and thereby approves the application for submittal to the Wyoming Economic Development and Stabilization Board for their consideration.

Nina Adams, County Planner gave her administrator's report for the month of December, 1991.

A motion was made by Graalman, seconded by Fleming and unanimously carried to appoint Harry Russell III and Irene Archibald to three year terms on the Carbon County Planning & Development Board.

MEMORIAL HOSPITAL OF CARBON COUNTY BOARD

A motion was made by Graalman, seconded by Zeiger to appoint Steve Briggs to fill the term of William Newton on the Hospital Board. The vote was one for, and two against.

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A motion was made by Fleming , seconded by Graalman and unanimously carried to appoint Lorna Engstrom to fill the unexpired term of William Newton on the Memorial Hospital Board beginning January 7, 1992 and ending July 1, 1992.

4-H HORSE JUDGING TEAM

Jamie Stratton and Loretta Howieson representing the 4-H Horse Judging Team, appeared before the Commissioners to thank the Commissioners for financially supporting the team's recent trip.

ROAD & BRIDGE

Don Neuman Road & Bridge supervisor, gave his administrative report.

A motion was made by Fleming, seconded by Graalman and carried to enter into a gravel lease agreement with James Wiant for the period of time between January 1, 1992 to January 1, 1994.

Neuman discussed recent correspondence from Joseph Yovich of the Wyoming Department of Transportation.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS, the meeting was adjourned.
