

**MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF
CARBON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING
Tuesday, September 7, 2010
County Courthouse, Rawlins, Wyoming**

The regular meeting of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners (BOCC) commenced Tuesday, September 7, 2010 at the County Courthouse in Rawlins, Wyoming. Attending the meeting were Chairman Terry Weickum; Vice Chairman Jerry Paxton; Deputy County Attorney Mike Kelly; and County Clerk Gwynn Bartlett. Commissioner Charles C. Young was absent.

Chairman Weickum called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m.

Commissioner Young joined the meeting at 9:05 a.m.

CLERK

Minutes

Commissioner Young moved to approve the minutes of the August 24, 2010 regular meeting of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners as presented. Commissioner Paxton seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Clerk Bartlett asked the BOCC to amend the minutes of the August 3, 2010 regular meeting of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners as follows: Page 4, Ratification – Dixon Airport Master Plan Study, change motion to read “sponsor’s amount to be \$3,000.00”.

Commission Young moved to approve the minutes of the August 3, 2010 regular meeting of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners amending the sponsor’s amount to \$3,000.00 instead of \$25,000.00 to the Dixon Airport Project No. 03-56-0038-12. Commissioner Paxton seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Monthly Receipts

Commissioner Young moved to accept the report of Department of Planning and Development receipts for the month of August 2010 in the amount of \$1,812.00; Carbon County Clerk Statement of Fees Collected for the month of August 2010 in the amount of \$14,042.50; Road & Bridge receipts from July to August 2010 in the amount of \$570.00; and Clerk of District Court

receipts for month ending July 2010 in the amount of \$2,733.95. Commissioner Paxton seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Bonds

Commissioner Paxton moved to approve a bond for Cheryl M. Jordan, Municipality Recreation Director for the Town of Sinclair in the amount of \$5,000.00; Jerry Johnson, Treasurer for the Carbon County Predator Management District in the amount of \$5,000.00; and Codey J. Stocks, employee of the Little Snake River Museum District, bond rider changing Principal/Insured's name from Codey J. Stocks dba Little Snake River Museum to Codey J. Stocks. Commissioner Young seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

24-Hour Catering Permits

Clerk Bartlett reported she issued 24-hour catering permits to Old Baldy Corporation for the Old Baldy Club Platte River Cookout on September 20, 2010 and to the Rendezvous Lodge LLC for the Ryan Park Volunteers Fundraiser in Ryan Park on August 28, 2010.

Community Service Agency Contracts

Clerk Bartlett presented the community service agency contracts for the entities that were allocated funds from the 2010-2011 County budget and explained the purpose of the contract.

Commissioner Paxton moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on the Contract for Services Agreement between Carbon County and the Economic Development Corporation, Medicine Bow Health Center, Rawlins-Carbon County Airport Board, South Central Wyoming EMS, Old Pen Joint Powers Board and Town of Rock River for funds allocated from the 2010-2011 County budget. Commissioner Young seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Employee Benefit Plan

Clerk Bartlett presented an amendment to the Carbon County Employee Benefit Plan for the Chairman's signature replacing Section A – Eligible Employees under Eligibility, Enrollment and Effective Date of coverage.

Commissioner Paxton moved to approve the Summary of Material Modification and Amendment #2 to the Carbon County Employee Benefit Plan Group No. 02104, replacing Section A – Eligible Employees under Eligibility, Enrollment and Effective Date of coverage, effective September 1, 2010. Commissioner Young seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Clerk Bartlett advised Mark Moreno from Meritain Health will be here this afternoon to discuss the health plan renewal. Chairman Weickum advised the current plan is for two years and the County may want to put the next renewal out for bids.

Master Lease-Purchase Agreement – Amendment

Clerk Bartlett presented an amendment to the Master Lease-Purchase Agreement signed in 2009 noting that the amendment reduces the lease amount because the end dump truck was purchased for less than originally estimated.

Commissioner Young moved to amend the lease with Kinetic Leasing Corporation, Exhibit B1 to Schedule No. 104, Dated as of September 15, 2009 to Master Lease-Purchase Agreement No. CAR3157, Dated as of September 15, 2009. Commissioner Paxton seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Homeland Security Grant

Clerk Bartlett presented a Homeland Security Grant that would provide funding to support the Homeland Security/Emergency Management efforts within Carbon County and stated the grant is a 50/50 match program. She noted this grant is for the Emergency Management Coordinator's salary at three-quarter time and the next grant will be for the full-time amount as the effective date of this grant began on October 1, 2009. She added that Deputy Attorney Mike Kelly and

Emergency Management Coordinator John Zeiger have reviewed the grant agreement and recommend approval.

Commissioner Young moved to approve the Grant Award for the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Federal Emergency Management Agency Grant Programs Directorate FY 2010 Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) for Project ID 10-GPD-CAR-EM-GCF10 in the total amount of \$14,521.00 to enhance and sustain all-hazards emergency management capabilities, to support the emergency management mission areas and structure individual emergency management programs, for the term from October 1, 2009 to March 31, 2011. Commissioner Paxton seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Wyoming County Commissioners' Association Meeting

Clerk Bartlett advised that the fundraising letter for next year's Wyoming County Commissioner Association conference the County is hosting is complete however she is still waiting for a response from her and Chairman Weickum's August 12th meeting with the Old Penitentiary Joint Powers Board (JPB). She noted at that meeting the JPB agreed to respond within a couple weeks with an estimated price for a meal and tour there. The BOCC agreed to leave this out of the letter and asked Clerk Bartlett to plan for a welcome reception in Saratoga instead.

ELECTED OFFICIALS / DEPARTMENT HEADS

Attorney

Deputy Attorney Kelly discussed Dr. Raja Chandra's renewal contract and salary. He noted that the renewal is only through February 28, 2011. The BOCC asked Deputy Attorney Kelly to prepare a contract for the same amount as he is currently being paid.

Deputy Attorney Kelly reported he has been working with the State Land and Investment Board attorney regarding the Armory renewal lease. The BOCC advised Deputy Attorney Kelly to move forward with renewal and the County could pass on the renewal cost with users of the facility.

Chairman Weickum asked Deputy Attorney Kelly about the cleanup of the Skyline Acres property. He did suggest advertising so landowners can obtain their property that they can prove they own. The BOCC directed Deputy Attorney Kelly to proceed with this advertising. Clerk Bartlett advised she is looking into a Wyoming Business Council grant to fund the cleanup and she would report more later.

Road & Bridge

Bill Nation, Road & Bridge Superintendent reported that road construction for the Saratoga Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) 2010 project is beginning today. There was discussion of future CMAQ funds.

Commissioner Young left the meeting at 10:14 a.m.

Mr. Nation reported there is a highway department project and he will look into using that contractor to do some patching on County roads in the Little Snake River area. Commissioner Paxton suggested Mr. Nation let Barry Bryant, Dixon Airport Manager, know that the contractor is in the area in case the airport needed work done.

Treasurer

County Treasurer Cindy Baldwin noted that sales tax has increased significantly. She also reported on fuel sales at the Dixon Airport.

RECESS

Chairman Weickum called a recess at 10:22 a.m. and reconvened at 10:41a.m. Commissioner Young returned at 10:41 a.m.

COMMISSIONER DISCUSSION

Chairman Weickum noted he, Clerk Bartlett and Deputy Attorney Kelly attended the Memorial Hospital of Carbon County (MHCC) Board meeting last week regarding the specific purpose tax project. He also discussed financing of the project. Chairman Weickum reported he will sit on a panel regarding effects of wind energy of local governments. He also stated he will be meeting with the Wyoming Taxpayers Association about specific purpose tax issues. Chairman Weickum will continue to attend Leadership Wyoming.

Commissioner Paxton reported that he attended the interim Revenue Committee meeting regarding a model of how competitive Wyoming is compared to other western states for wind energy. He also recently attended the Resource Advisory Committee for Title II funds. He noted that paperwork was executed to enable expenditures for approved projects.

MEMORIAL HOSPITAL OF CARBON COUNTY (MHCC)

Dan Jessop, MHCC Chief Executive Officer, and Loren Simnett MHCC Board President, overviewed MHCC's financial information. Financing of the specific purpose tax project was discussed.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner Paxton moved to go into executive session at 11:26 a.m. with Clerk Bartlett and Deputy Attorney Mike Kelly to discuss personnel, potential litigation and other matters considered confidential by law. Commissioner Young seconded and the motion carried unanimously

Commissioner Paxton moved to come out of executive session at 11:42 a.m. and that the minutes of the session be approved as written and sealed and declared that no action was taken during the session. Commissioner Young seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

RECESS

Chairman Weickum recessed for lunch at 11:43 a.m. and reconvened at 1:37 p.m.

PLANNING & ZONING

Certification of Z.C. Case File No. 2010-02, C.U. Case File No. 2010-05 and Proposed Amendment to the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 2003 Amended 11-17-2009

Sid Fox, County Planning Director presented the Certification of Recommended Action for Z.C. Case File No. 2010-02, C.U. Case File No. 2010-05 and Proposed Amendment to the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 2003 Amended 11-17-2009 on behalf of the Planning & Zoning Commission.

Commissioner Paxton moved to schedule a public hearing for October 5, 2010 at 1:30 p.m. at the County Courthouse in Rawlins, Wyoming to hear Z.C. Case File No. 2010-02, Tyler and Heather Mortensen's request for a Zone Change from Ranching, Agriculture, Mining (RAM) to Residential (RD) on Lot 21 of Tract "A" located in Ryan Park; C.U. Case File No. 2010-05, Union Telephone Company (Applicant) and Saratoga Land and Cattle Company, Inc. (Owner's) request for a Conditional Use Permit in a Ranching, Agriculture, Mining (RAM) Zone to allow a communication facility for cellular and microwave communications located on approximately 2,500 square feet; and Proposed Amendment to the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 2003 Amended 11-17-2009 – Chapter VII Sexually Oriented Businesses. Commissioner Young seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

DIXON AIRPORT MASTER PLAN

Steve Marshall, Airport Development Group presented the Dixon Airport Master Plan. Mr. Marshall discussed a proposed overlay district for zoning purposes around the Airport.

COOPERATIVE EXTENSION SERVICE

Cathy Craig introduced staff including Ron Cunningham, acting County Coordinator. Ms. Craig discussed vehicle usage by University of Wyoming (UW) Extension educators and other non-County individuals. Deputy Attorney Kelly presented a Motor Vehicle Indemnity Agreement to allow UW employees to operate County vehicles. Deputy Attorney Kelly stated similar agreements could be obtained from other offices but that these agreements do not cover other individuals operating or being transported in County vehicles.

Commissioner Paxton moved to approve the Motor Vehicle Indemnity Agreement with the University of Wyoming concerning the Cooperative Extension Service. Commissioner Young seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Vehicle usage was further discussed. Deputy Attorney Kelly further recommended to the BOCC that no non-County individuals be in the vehicle and noted that he will draft another memorandum of understanding with UW and he would recommend that UW's insurance cover non-County individuals.

BOARD INTERVIEW / APPOINTMENT

Christine Throgmorton interviewed for consideration of appointment to the Public Library Board.

Commissioner Paxton moved to appoint Christine Throgmorton to the Public Library Board to a three-year term expiring July 2013. Commissioner Young seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

MERITAIN HEALTH

Commissioner Young left the meeting at 3:00 p.m.

Mark Moreno and Brent Hillier of Meritain Health overviewed healthcare reform, a summary of expenses related to the County's health insurance and discussed a renewal.

Commissioner Paxton moved to accept Cigna as the County's reinsurance carrier at specific level of \$45,000.00 for the insurance renewal effective October 1, 2010. Chairman Weickum seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Paxton moved to approve an amendment to be prepared for the disease management plan enhanced program to be paid at 50% each not subject to deductible. Chairman Weickum seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Paxton moved that effective September 30, 2011 Carbon County will no longer offer any County benefits to any non-County employees and to authorize letters be signed by the Chairman to Noyes Clinic, Medicine Bow Rural Healthcare District, Senior Services, Carbon County Weed & Pest, and the Carbon County Library System. Chairman Weickum seconded and the motion carried unanimously.
