

**MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF
CARBON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING
Tuesday, February 15, 2011
County Courthouse, Rawlins, Wyoming**

The regular meeting of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners (BOCC) commenced Tuesday, February 15, 2011 at the County Courthouse in Rawlins, Wyoming. Attending the meeting were Chairman Terry Weickum; Vice Chairman Jerry Paxton; Commissioner Leo Chapman; Deputy County Attorney Mike Kelly; County Clerk Gwynn Bartlett; and Deputy Clerk Kathy Turner.

Chairman Weickum called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.

AUDIT

Nicholas Grooms, CPA and Partner with Mader Tschacher Peterson & Co., LLC reviewed Carbon County’s Financial and Compliance Report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010.

RECESS

Chairman Weickum recessed at 10:46 a.m. and reconvened at 10:56 a.m.

CLERK

Minutes

Commissioner Paxton moved to approve the minutes of the February 1, 2011 regular meeting of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners as presented. Commissioner Chapman seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Monthly Receipts

Commissioner Chapman moved to approve the Clerk of District Court receipts for the month ending January 2011 in the amount of \$3,654.40. Commissioner Paxton seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Bond

Commissioner Chapman moved to approve a bond for Theresa A. Johnson, Treasurer for the City of Elk Mountain in the amount of \$25,000.00. Commissioner Paxton seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Homeland Security Grant Funds

Clerk Bartlett reported she recently held a workgroup to expend approximately \$300,000.00 from numerous Homeland Security Grants and she agreed to coordinate with the groups authorized to expend funds and facilitate the purchases. She stated the purchases include radios, training, exercises, generator and self contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) bottles. She noted they will meet again in approximately one month.

Agreement for Services – County Health Officer

Clerk Bartlett presented an agreement between Archie P. Kirsch, M.D. and Carbon County Government to provide services and salary as the Carbon County Health Officer and noted that Dr. Kirsch has signed the agreement. She stated that Deputy Attorney Kelly and Bridget Hettgar from Public Health have reviewed the agreement and recommend approval.

Commissioner Chapman moved to approve the Agreement for Services between Archie P. Kirsch, M.D., and Carbon County Government for Dr. Kirsch to act as the County's Health Officer for a term beginning March 1, 2011 through February 28, 2012. Commissioner Paxton seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Grant Award Agreement – Carbon County Action Committee

Clerk Bartlett presented a grant agreement from the Wyoming Department of Health for the Carbon County Action Committee to provide services and activities to low-income people. She stated Deputy Attorney Kelly has reviewed the agreement and recommends approval. She noted that Cindy Baldwin, Chairperson of the Action Committee must also sign the agreement.

Commissioner Chapman moved to approve the Grant Award Agreement for the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families, Office of Community Services Between the State of Wyoming, Department of Health, Rural and Frontier Health Division, Community Services Block Grant Program and Carbon County Action Committee to provide services and activities to low-income people as described in the agreement totaling \$25,000.00 for a term from May 1, 2011 through September 30, 2011. Commissioner Paxton seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Letter of Support

Clerk Bartlett presented a draft letter of support for the Town of Medicine Bow's Business Ready Community Grant application for Wyoming Industries, Inc. who will manufacture hair-care products in Medicine Bow.

Commissioner Chapman moved to accept a letter of support to the Wyoming Business Council, supporting the Town of Medicine Bow's Business Ready Community Grant application for Wyoming Industries, Inc. who will manufacture hair-care products nationally at the former Medicine Bow school facility. Commissioner Paxton seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Hanna Old Bank Building

Clerk Bartlett presented a letter appointing First American Title Insurance Company as the Closing Agent for the old bank building in Hanna for the closing terms on the building for the sale to Shepard Construction.

Commissioner Chapman moved to approve the closing terms and appoint First American Title Insurance Company as the Closing Agent for the purchase and sale of real property located at the old bank building in Hanna, Wyoming. Commissioner Paxton seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Town of Hanna

Clerk Bartlett advised a letter was received from Tony Poulos, Mayor of Hanna, stating that the town has a need for a four-wheel drive dually pick-up truck and should the county have a truck scheduled for replacement or disposal, the town would like to be considered for a donation.

Chairman Weickum stated there was a one ton fire truck that was equipped as a quick attack truck that the town wanted and it was agreed to leave the truck as a fire truck. He stated the town did need a truck and he advised them that the county does at times have trucks to trade in or dispose of and he would like the town to get a truck if one becomes available.

Early Retiree Program

Clerk Bartlett advised Carbon County has been approved for participation in the Early Retiree Reinsurance Program.

Historic Trails Resource Conservation and Development

Clerk Bartlett noted it is time to renew the sponsorship with the Historic Trails Resource Conservation & Development Council for 2011 and advised the previous county representative has resigned. She stated the dues are \$100.00 per year and asked if the BOCC would like to continue as a sponsor. The BOCC asked Commissioner Chapman to review the group's documents and determine if he would like to serve as the county's representative.

AGENDA AMENDMENT

Commissioner Paxton moved to amend the agenda to add Carbon County Community Juvenile Services Board at 11:15 a.m. Commissioner Chapman seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

ELECTED OFFICIALS / DEPARTMENT HEADS

Sheriff

Sheriff Jerry Colson stated each year all county jails are audited regarding incarceration of juveniles. The results of the 2009 audit were presented and Sheriff Colson noted Carbon County is in full compliance with no violations.

Attorney

Deputy Attorney Kelly, reported that the Lost Creek Uranium Mine meeting is scheduled for March 7. He reported the final lease for the Armory building is being prepared. He reported a special meeting is scheduled for February 22 in Cheyenne to discuss the Dixon Airport with the Federal Aviation Administration.

Deputy Attorney Kelly discussed a partial release request from Arch Coal and he recommended that the BOCC approve and indicate its approval by not responding. Deputy Attorney Kelly discussed that the county's fire department is being dispatched into Sweetwater County regularly therefore he recommends a memorandum of understanding be prepared to address these calls.

Deputy Attorney Kelly presented a quitclaim deed to abandon an easement on a roadway between County Roads 3 and 101.

Commissioner Paxton moved to approve a quitclaim deed to abandon an easement on a parcel of land in the SE ¼ of Section 20, T20N, R80W of the 6th P.M., Carbon County, Wyoming. Commissioner Chapman seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Deputy Attorney Kelly discussed a contract with Carbon County Road & Bridge and PMPC Engineering and a proposed project manual for the Savery Creek bridge project that he was asked by Bill Nation, Road & Bridge Superintendent to present.

Commissioner Paxton moved to authorize Bill Nation to execute a general contract between Carbon County Road & Bridge and PMPC Engineering for services. Commissioner Chapman seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Deputy Attorney Kelly reported that an interpleader suit has been filed in Carbon County District Court on behalf of the bonding company for WyCon. He stated he has received two of three lien releases he requires and he is now looking for authorization from the BOCC to allow the county to deposit the county's retainage of \$105,659.56.

Commissioner Paton moved to authorize Deputy Attorney Kelly to release \$105,659.56 of county funds to the Carbon County Clerk of District Court for resolution to the debt owed on the Carbon County Fairgrounds multipurpose facility. Commissioner Chapman seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Deputy Attorney Kelly discussed 4H use of county vehicles. He stated after a call from a citizen, he contacted other county attorneys who were not aware 4H individuals were using their county's vehicles. He also researched liability insurance that other counties have that might allow 4H to use county vehicles. There was discussion of possible solutions and ultimately the BOCC asked Clerk Bartlett and Deputy Attorney Kelly to continue to try to find a solution that would eliminate the county's exposure while covering the 4H participants and report back at the next meeting.

Planning

Sid Fox, County Planner, discussed a proposed fee schedule and changes to the conditional use permit fee.

Emergency Management

John Zeiger, Emergency Management Coordinator, reported on meetings and trainings he will be attending.

Senior Services

Jill Duthie, Senior Services Director, discussed the recent staff changes in their office and reassured the BOCC that seniors' needs are still being met. She stated the office has been cooperating with the individuals investigating the wrong-doing that is alleged to have taken place.

Museum

Tiffany Wilson, Museum Director, discussed the new storage building proposed to be constructed. She also discussed funding the county gave the Museum in their current budget to construct the storage facility. She stated the storage facility will be completely paid for with grant funds and she discussed proposed expenditures for the county's allocated funding. She proposes using funding towards core samples at the new Museum site, emergency exits at the current site, and the remainder to save towards the new facility. The BOCC agreed.

RECESS

Chairman Weickum called a recess at 11:57 a.m. and reconvened 12:03 p.m.

CARBON COUNTY COMMUNITY JUVENILE SERVICES BOARD

Dawnessa Snyder, Chair of the Community Juvenile Services Board, updated the BOCC about their current projects and activities. Ms. Snyder stated there is a crisis center committee committed towards implementing a crisis center somewhere in the county. She stated on average at any given time there is 25-40 juveniles placed out of county and to be able to keep the kids locally would greatly improve the program. Ms. Snyder requested authorization to apply for a \$25,000.00 grant from the public welfare foundation with no match and Wyoming State Advisory Council in the amount of \$40,000.00. She noted this requires a 50% match however this can be in-kind. Clerk Bartlett asked that she and Treasurer Baldwin be allowed to review the applications and awards to ensure the county can comply with any requirements.

Commissioner Paxton moved to authorize the Community Juvenile Services Board to apply for a \$25,000.00 grant from the Public Welfare Foundation grant after further consultation with Clerk Bartlett and Treasurer Baldwin. Commissioner Chapman seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Paxton moved to authorize the Community Juvenile Services Board to apply for a \$40,000.00 grant from the Wyoming State Advisory Council Juvenile Justice Division Title V funds after further consultation with Clerk Bartlett and Treasurer Baldwin. Commissioner Chapman seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

COMMISSIONERS DISCUSSION

Chairman Weickum discussed a Governor's announcement today about a wind plant to be constructed in Cheyenne. There was further discussion of wind energy and related taxes.

Commissioner Paxton reported on a meeting he recently attended in Salt Lake City regarding Secretarial Order #3310 and further discussed the order.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, Chairman Weickum adjourned the meeting at 12:52 p.m.
